MISS TAGGART CHARMED VERY LARGE AUDIENCE

Sang Many Scotch Songs to Great
Delight of Everyone Present
At Theatre.

**ORCHESTRA SHOWED
GREAT IMPROVEMENT**

"Ah mon an' it was great!" that was the expression heard from a visitor to the Westholme Theatre last night when Jennie Taggart, the great soprano, charmed an immense audience with her songs of Scotland. Being St. Andrew's Day it was particularly appropriate.

Miss Taggart's voice is wonderful. Her range, power and expression are such that it seems as if there was nothing impossible to her. It was perhaps in the thrilling Scotch song "Angus Macdonald" that she was most appealing, the dramatic effect of this great composition being particularly suited to the lady's histrionic sense.

Owing to her having no music for some of the old songs, she she played several of her own accompaniments, and so well did she do it that these songs were just as popular with the audience as the ones in which she had an accompanist.

Of one thing Jennie Taggart may be sure. She will always be able to command a crowded house at any time she may consent to sing here.

Other Singers.

The other vocal soloist was M. Davis who sang most effectively and gave a Welsh air for an encore number. He should be heard often here.

J. Peyton gave "Somewhere a Voice is Calling" on the cornet and for an encore "Love's Sweet Song."

J. Davey and A. Clapperton in a vocal duet "Excelsior" sang most pleasingly and were recalled.

The Symphony orchestra is steadily improving. The players are gaining confidence. Last night their ensemble and attack was much better than on any previous occasion. They played with a swing which indicated increasing confidence in themselves. Professor Harvey has them well in hand and is gradually getting them into the professional class. Their efforts last night were much appreciated.
