

Flight-Lieut. J. N. Boothman, flying a seaplane seven times over the 31-mile course at an average speed of 340.08 miles per hour, won for the third time in succession the Schneider Cup race for Great Britain. The Trophy is now the permanent property of the Royal Aero Club of England. Dead Sphagnum Moss Can be Put To Good Use, It is Believed

MONTREAL, Nov. 4-The event ual manufacture of wall board, lit parts of Canada is foreshadowed by the successful inauguration of the new Carlson Building Company plant at Edmonton where the conversion of muskeg into wallboard began this month.

According to the Natural Resources Department of the Canadian National experiments are already being conducted with a view to determining the cellulose content of various deposits, particu-'arly those of the Hudson Bay Railway region, as on this factor depends its suitability as raw material for paper stock, coarse products.
