LARGE RELIEF BUDGET IS NECESSARY, ROBERTSON SAYS

Dominion Expects To Spend Thirty Million on Distress This Year

British Columbia Program Aggregating \$5,750,000 Has Been Approved, Minister of Labor Announces-Dominion Pays Big Share

OTTAWA, Nov. 4:-It is a conservative estimate to state that the total federal contributions for relief of unemployment and distress in Canada will exceed \$30,000,000 apart from direct relief requirements, Senator Gideon D. Robertson, minister of labor, stated yesterday. For British Columbia the Dominion has approved municipal and provincial work ggregating in cost more than \$5,750,000. Of this the Dominion's share is \$2,893,000.
