## "Just Another Case of Failing To Understand Simple Thing" 'Tis Said

Repayment of \$700 Was Skeena Member's Long Outstanding Right, It Is Clearly Explained to Legislature

VICTORIA, March 19:-Dr. H. C. Wrinch and A. M. Manson replied in the Legislature Wednesday to the accusations made by Hon. W. C. Shelly Tuesday that they combined to repay \$700 taxes to Dr. Wrinch illegally in the last days of the former Liberal government. "This is just another case where Mr. Shelly has failed to understand a simple transaction," de-

clared Mr. Manson, who described the accusation as "twaddle." In calm, simple language Dr. Wrinch laid before the House the whole facts of the transaction under fire.



Coroner's Jury Holds Corporation Responsible for Georgia Street Tragedy

VANCOUVER, March 19:-Holding that "insufficient precautions are provided in the way of warning signs in case of the bridge undergoing repairs" and that "the evidence also shows that the parapet failed to provide sufficient protection to the party," a coroner's jury yesterday placed the blame for the quadruple fatality early Sunday morning, in which four people lost their lives when their car skidded and plunged over the Georgia Street viaduct, upon the Corporation of the City of Vancouver.
