NEWS OF THE MINES

AROUND PRINCE RUPERT

Seeking Placer on Skeena River—Gold and Silver Affinity—Mill for B. C. Silver?

For quite a time several prospectors of the Hazelton district have been quietly employed along the banks of the Skeena River for a distance of several miles up and down endeavouring to find what the river bed may have to offer in the way of placer operations. That there is gold in the Skeena bottom has been known for many years, and the

black sands along the shores have often been disturbed by those in quest for the precious metal but, so far, it has only been found in very small quantities, hardly justifying profitable occupation. Some years ago a syndicate was formed and large stretches of the river, both above and below Hazelton, were staked with a view to large scale operations but the movement never came to anything. It is the patches of black sand in various depths along the river that the men are at present working on. Apparently, there have been no very spectacular results as yet. There are a number of men both from Hazelton and New Hazelton on the job. The river is about as low now as it has been for years and the time for such work is now opportune because the flood season will start in two or three months.

Straight gold mines—that is, mines producing only gold—are very few and far between, writes Donald C. Simpson of Smithers in the Interior News. There appears to be a natural affinity between gold and silver and it is in very rare exceptions where one can be mined without the other. The Premier mine, for instance, contains about equal values in gold and silver. On Hudson Bay Mountain there are goodly numbers of mines and prospects some of which carry gold and silver in fairly equal values. In some, like the Duthie, silver predominates. In others, like the Marmie and Glacier Gulch, gold is the predominating value. On the Babine conditions are a good deal similar to those on Hudson Bay Mountain. On both sides of the Bulkley and Skeena Rivers from their sources to their mouths, it is impossible almost to take a sample of ore from any property that does not carry some gold and silver values. Mr. Simpson approves of the idea for the calling of an international conference where a fixed value for silver in relation to gold would be mutually agreed upon.

Reports continue to be heard that the Premier Gold Mining Co. Ltd. and B. C. Silver cannot reach an agreement with a view to milling of the latter's ores through the former's concentrating plant at Premier. H. L. Batten, well known Vancouver mining engineer, recently visited B. C. Silver and his trip is reported to have been in connection with the installation of a mill on B. C. Silver. C. A. Banks, managing director, at the annual meeting of B. C. Silver in January, intimated that the B. C. Silver property was so far developed as to justify the installation of a mill.
