About the age of 12 he engaged in a variety of business enterprises, including newsboy on the Grand Trunk Railway between Port Huron and Detroit, proprietor of a newsstand and book store and of a vegetable market, and employing 11 boys to assist him in these various activities At 15 he turned to journalism and with some old equipment purchased from the Detroit Free Press, set up his shop in the baggage car of his train. There he published the Grand Trunk Herald, said to have been the first newspaper published on board a train.
