 VERNON, B.C., Jan. 30.—Alfred Barnes, formerly chief of police at Armstrong, was today sentenced to 12 months' imprisonment at Okalla jail by Judge Swanson in County Court. Barnes was found guilty on a charge of fraudulently omitting to tender a correct account of funds collected for motor licences.
