

# A Permanent Home For Someone In Prince Rupert

**FREQUENT PAINTING PROTECTS AND MAINTAINS APPEARANCE OF HOME**

Prevents Rusting of Metals

A good job of exterior painting, when dry, should be neither powdery nor sticky, but should dry hard with a slight gloss. There always has been, and probably always will be, a great deal of discussion over the correct materials and proportions to use in mixing good durable paint, but one cannot go wrong by using nationally advertised brands of ready-mixed paints.

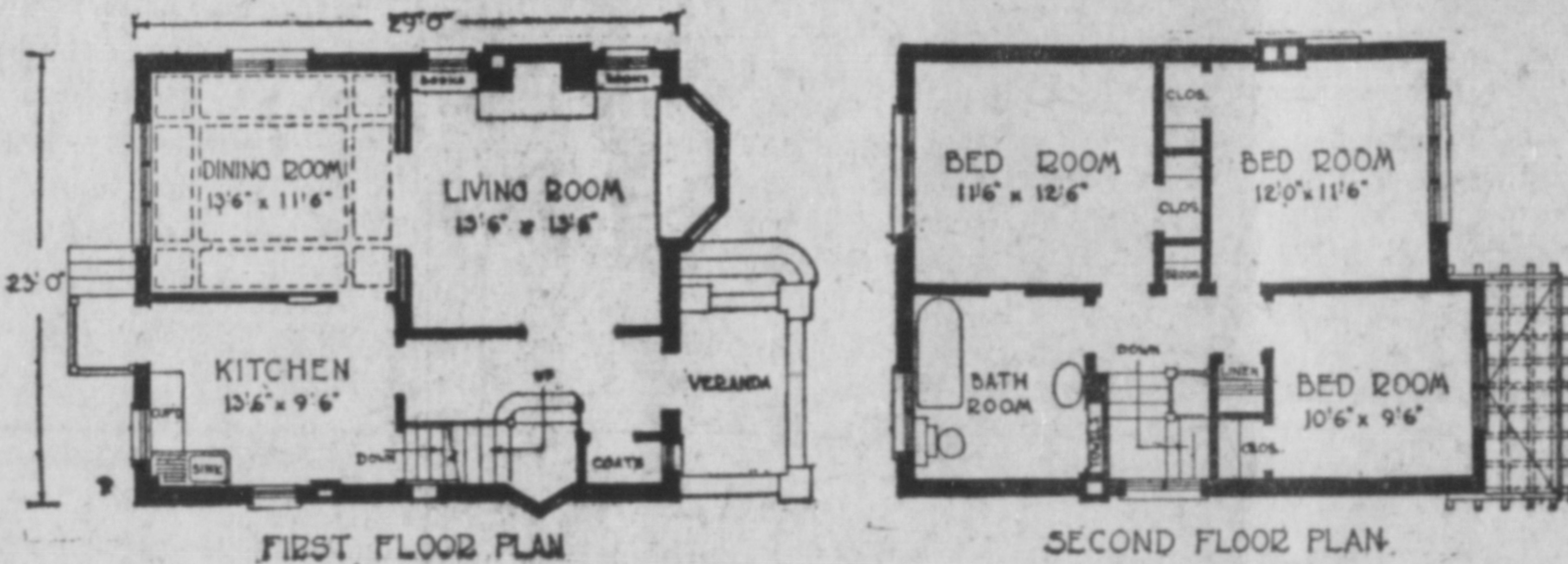
While periodical repainting is, of course, necessary to keep a house from becoming shabby, the most important reason for painting is for protection. If dampness is permitted to penetrate the wood for some time, swelling, warping, and eventually even rotting of the woodwork follows. Wood window sills and other flat surfaces which receive the full force of falling rains should be carefully watched for exposed bare wood and signs of rot.

Woodwork also needs protection from the sun's rays, which without good painting, literally cook the pitch and sap and other vital preservative elements out of the wood, causing shrinkage, cracking and even warping, and the subsequent opening up of joints, which permits the entrance of dampness and moisture to a greater extent than before.

When repainting metal or woodwork all loose particles of rust and dirt must be scraped, sand-papered and brushed off to provide a clean solid base for new coats. Even new work must be free of dirt and other loose foreign matter before painting. On new woodwork all knots and other pitchy surfaces must be sealed with shellac to prevent the pitch from working through the paint. If this precaution is not taken, each and every knot will be clearly visible.

New woodwork should be primed, i.e., painted with white lead and linseed oil thinned with turpentine immediately upon delivery to the job or after its erection in place to prevent moisture from penetrating the dry, open pores of the raw wood. The effect of rain on unpainted wood surfaces is to "raise" or expand certain soft portions of the grain which form ridges on the surface. ## A COMFORTABLE, ATTRACTIVE SIX-ROOM HOUSE

This modern home is ideal for city location although it would be equally suitable as a suburban home. Designed for a lot facing south its rooms are arranged to get the best benefit from the sun. It is a compact house and a lot with a frontage of 35 feet is ample for its erection.

Above the foundation of brick the walls are built of red range brick, with the exception of the projecting gable over the front entrance and the upper rear portion of the house which is composed of stucco.

The interior is arranged to suit the needs of the average family and details which give pleasing effects are incorporated in the rooms. In the living room, the ceiling is of California stucco with cornice and the floor is of red oak. The book-lover would feel at home in this room with bookshelves placed on both sides of the fireplace.

Separating the living room from the dining room are sliding doors. Beamed ceiling and oak floor similar to that of the living room are features of the well proportioned

dining room. Electrical outlets are placed in convenient places for lamps and other necessities.

The kitchen is of convenient size and possible layout of kitchen equipment has been considered in its planning so that the housework may be carried on efficiently.

The large bathroom on the second floor is tiled. Modern fixtures occupy good positions in it, the wash basin being of the pedestal type.

A hot water heating system has been designed for the house with a round sectional boiler in the basement. This home should not be difficult to heat because of its layout and simple form.
