### Plan Large Beach For Winnipeggers

WINNIPEG, July 28.—Plans for a huge bathing beach, accommodating 20,000 persons are under consideration for Winnipeg by the Parks Board. The beach would be created on the shores of the Assiniboine River, opposite City Park, in the west end of the city.

Damming of the river and dredging would be done. Deep water for the expert swimmers and shallow water for children and novices would be provided besides facilities for boating, at a total cost of \$30,000.

If the scheme is undertaken for unemployment relief purposes, one-third of the cost would be paid by the Dominion government, one-third by the province, and one-third by the city. Herbert Cottingham, chairman of the Parks Board, sponsored the idea which he declares is greatly favored by Mayor Ralph Webb.
