MASTER OF PR. HENRY

Capt. H. O. Giffin Was in Command For Trip to Halifax

HALIFAX, Dec. 14:—Captain H. O. Giffin is in command of ss. Prince Henry on her cruise from Vancouver to Halifax.

Captain Giffin, who is a native of Nova Scotia, has been in command of ss. Lady Drake, operating on the West Indies Service. He has had many years of experience at sea and is an experienced navigator.

SS. Prince Henry left Vancouver on the night of November 21 for a 23-day cruise via the Panama Canal to Halifax. Stops were made at San Francisco, San Pedro, Manzanillo, at both ends of the Canal Zone; Havana, Hamilton, en route to Halifax, arriving here yesterday. Following arrival on the Atlantic ss. Prince Henry will go into regular service, operating between Boston and Bermuda.

Alex Monroe continues his duties as chief engineer on the Prince Henry. Mr. Monroe is well known on the Pacific Coast, having been a member of the engineers' department of the Canadian National Steamships since 1910.

The position of ship's doctor has been filled by Dr. R. D. Orok of The Pas, Man.

F. Yates is purser with L. Fenton and R. E. Burke as assistants. The wireless department is in charge of T. G. Gilliland and Don Jenkins.

I read with interest in yesterday's issue of your paper, Dr. Large's report on the health of the school children. All who read his statements must surely see the need of action in the matter. In these days of stress it is terribly hard for some parents to feed and clothe their children and medical attention is a luxury.

I have a son of whom a report was sent to me last year of bad teeth. I took him to a dentist and he refused to take them out, saying it was too early to do so. Parents can't always be blamed for neglect on that score.

I know the suggestion has been mooted to do away with the manual training section of the city schools, in its stead opening a children's clinic with the money now spent on that. No doubt manual training is very nice and helpful, but surely if it is a choice between a clinic for their health's sake and manual training, there is a far more crying need at the present time for the clinic. It would be interesting, Mr. Editor, to invite discussion on this subject.
