Britain is to be represented in every branch of sport at the Olympic Games at Antwerp next year. This is somewhat of a surprise as it was thought that Britain would have very little to do with the great meet. Lord Downing has been elected president of the British Olympic council. The new leader has been noted for his love of outdoor sport and it is expected that his organizing abilities will aid materially in the showing that will be made by the British at Antwerp.

The Davis Cup international championship tennis games will be held in Sydney, Australia, on January 16, 17 and 18. English and Australian teams will compete for the world's championship and it is understood that United States will enter a challenge next year.

It is said that Frank Patrick, manager of the Vancouver Millionaires, is in favor of a play-off between the P. C. H. A. winners this year and the winners in the Alberta Amateur League. The constitution of both leagues would have to be altered to provide for this.

The Czechoslovaks are to enter teams in many branches of the Antwerp Olympic Games. They will enter in football, wrestling, boxing and many of the track events.
