

WENDLE HAS FINE RECORD

Has Not Lost a Single Fight In His Last Five Starts

A review of Benny Wendle's boxing matches during the past two years shows that he has a fighting record to be proud of, having won all of his last five ring battles, some by the knockout route.



Silver, Big Missouri, George Gold Copper, Silverado, Toric, Dalhousie, Woodbine and Los Angeles-Vancouver Mines Ltd. For the most of these properties Dr. Mandy has favorable re-
