## MENACE OF AIRPLANES

Wild Life Must Be Protected From Air, Government Orders

OTTAWA, Jan. 13.—As a sequel to complaints that airplanes are becoming as much of a menace to Canadian animal life as automobiles to pedestrians, the department of National Defence has issued warning to pilots and aviation interests of the Dominion that special precaution must be taken to protect wild life.

Two warning circulars issued by the department are the outcome of representations made by the Canadian National Silver Fox Breeders' Association and the Association of Provincial and Dominion Game Officials. The former body requested co-operation to prevent low flying over fox farms, because of loss and damage done during the fox whelping season. The game officials asked that pilots be reminded of "the threat which airplanes make against wild life, including game and water fowl."

To overcome the aero-danger to fox raising, distinguishing marks will likely be provided at fox farms which aviators will be able to see from the air. Yellow and black paint will be striped on watch towers and pylons to warn day flyers. To mark those farms located on night air mail routes, the department suggests that red lights of sufficient power, to be seen three miles away, be set up on the farm site.
