It is a matter of fact that halibut production on this coast this year is away below that of last year and it is also a matter of fact that frozen stocks this spring were well below the average for five years. If all other commodities are going to sell for less than before, it would seem natural that halibut must also sell for less and any attempt to prevent such a natural result would be artificial indeed.

No one is going to deny that the halibut fisherman is going in the C hole these days. If it is impossible or unsound for him to endeavor to 25c hold up the price of his produce, the natural thing for him to at-15c tempt, then, is to lower his cost of operation.
