Another of Wilson's Points Gone by the Board.

One of President Wilson's famous fourteen points mentioned a general reduction of armaments. Yesterday came the announcement that there was to be an increase in the United States navy until it was equal to any other.

Probably the President meant what he said when he issued that memorable document showing what the United States stood for. Unhappily the President of the United States is not responsible to Congress and there is no cohesion in the Government of that country as there is under a responsible government. The result is that Congress can at any time nullify the acts of the President.

While formerly it was a race between Great Britain and Germany for naval predominance, it now seems as if it might be a struggle in the same direction between Japan and the United States. Instead of having fought our last war, we may be just at the beginning of a series of wars, unless the statesmen of the world get a broader vision than they seem to have today.

People Extravagant, But Buying Insurance.

At the recent convention of life insurance men in New York the president of one of the big companies gave an address in which he said:

"While standing accused of exceeding all their former speed records in extravagance and reckless spending, the American people are nevertheless buying this year about eight billion dollars of old line life insurance, or two and one-half times the amount they acquired in 1914.

"The war thrust upon us an unnatural and unbalanced prosperity and has left us a legacy of inflation, speculation and excessive improvidence. A large volume of easy money has found its way into the National Treasury, and into the pockets of many people to whom a substantial cash surplus was a new and tempting possession. There has followed, among those of improvident and self-indulgent tendencies, a passion for expenditure in the pursuit of pleasure and costly non-essentials which undoubtedly has no parallel in history.

"How has life insurance responded in these wasteful days of 1919 to the urge for renewed vigor in spreading the gospel of thrift? In round millions the volume of new insurance which life insurance companies have induced the people to take during the year 1919 promises to reach the enormous total of \$7,712,000,000. This is \$3,010,000,000, or 64 per cent., more than was written last year. It is nearly \$4,613,000,000 more than was written in the year 1914, or 149 per cent."

Toronto Prices

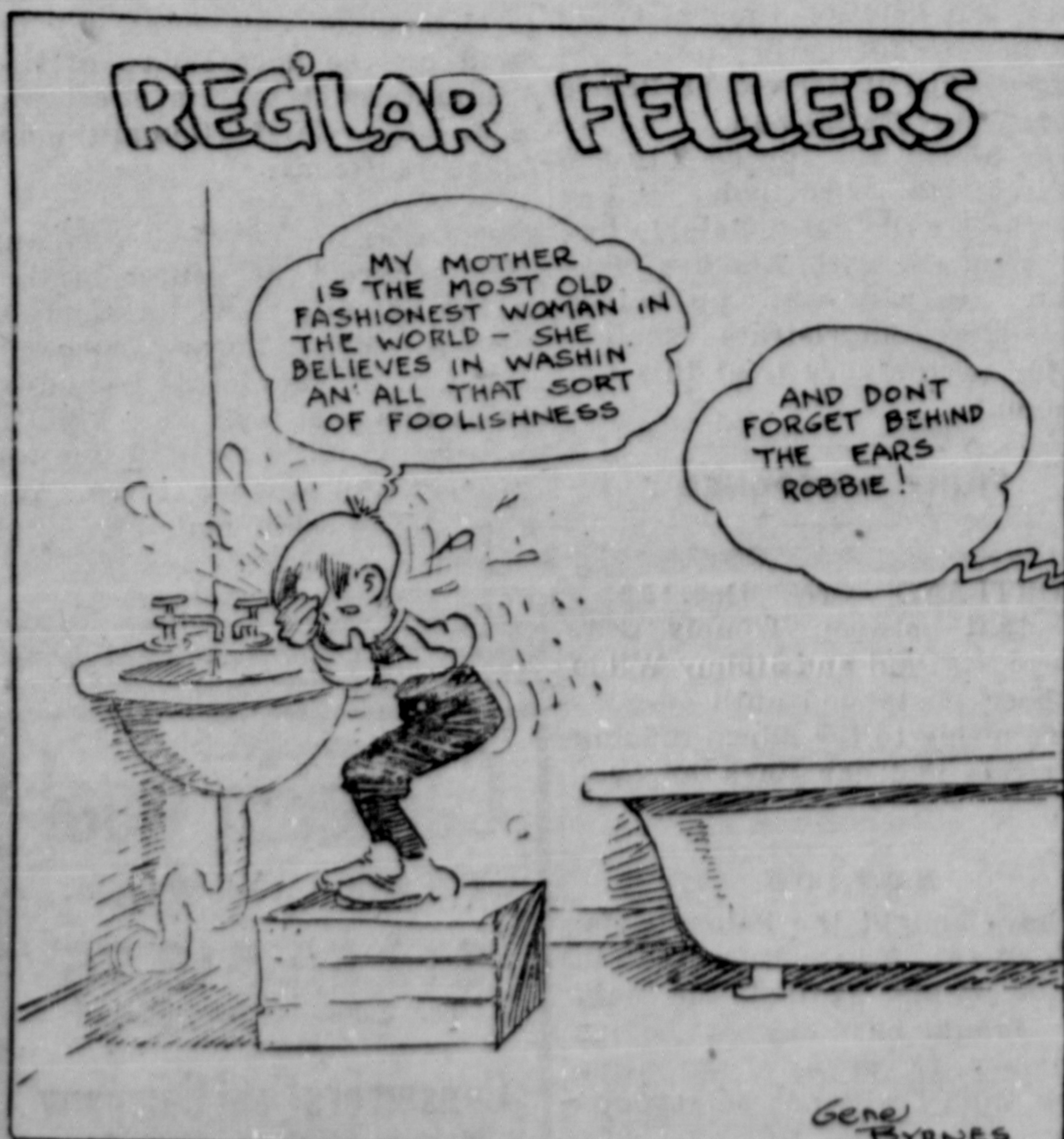
And Prince Rupert.

Eastern papers to hand show that on November 22 fresh eggs were selling on the Toronto market at \$1.30 a dozen, while on the same day they were purchased in Prince Rupert for \$1.10 for the strictly fresh variety. Butter on that date sold in Toronto at 75c, a pound and in Prince Rupert at 70c. These are just two instances that give an idea of the relative cost of living here and in the East. Possibly in some articles Toronto is cheaper, but on the whole there is little difference.

Local Actors Equal To Many Professionals.

There is no suggestion of local preferences in saying that the amateurs who put on the play under the Prince Rupert Amateur Dramatic Society this week are equal to the average professional and much cleverer than many professionals who visit cities this size. They showed decided histrionic talent and careful training.
