DREAD DISEASE MAY COME HERE

Victoria Health Officer Gives Interesting Statement Following Study.

SOUTHERN CITIES PREPARING FOR IT

The epidemic of sleeping sickness that appears to be spreading across Canada may be expected in British Columbia, according to an announcement made last week by Dr. Arthur G. Price, medical officer for the city of Victoria. The dread disease has now reached as far west as Calgary, one case being reported there the day before yesterday.

Dr. Price has been carrying on research work into the mysterious disease which has been alarming the people of the East and the Middle West, in order to guard the health of the people of Victoria and handle the disease if it does come, as it may.

Facts he has gathered lead him to believe that sleeping sickness may be closely connected with influenza, following the ravages of this plague, like paralysis followed diphtheria a few years ago. Dr. Price points out the difference between the true sleeping sickness which is an endemic disease caused by the bite of the tsetse fly in tropical countries, and the disease that is now laying low people on the prairies and United States and baffling medical men.

Must Quarantine Cases.
The health departments of the southern cities are making preparations to deal with the spread of the disease and if it appears it will be made a notifiable disease and persons affected with it will be placed under strict quarantine.
