Railway From Peace River To Connect It Up With Coast Asked

Strong Petition Presents Logical Arguments in Favor of National Undertaking—Support of Mayors of Country Being Sought

The general council of the Associated Peace River Boards of Trade is addressing a strong memorandum to mayors of cities of Western Canada urging the construction of a railway outlet for the Peace River country out of national credit as an effective means of alleviating the present unemployment and business crisis in the country.
