

he injured passengers in the car away from the frosty air outside, and until arrangements could be made for their removal and comfort. One woman suffered a dislocated shoulder, and other three mostly from shock and bruises. They were taken out on stretchers and attended to by doctors and nurses who had by this time arrived from Edson. The work of rescue seemed to be left to the passengers and crew of each individual car at first, but in time the work became general. And it cannot be said that any one who was fit neglected to do their part.

The C.N.R. and officials cannot be too highly praised for their attentions and courtesies to passengers both injured and fit during and after the accident. All was provided with medical attention who required that care, meals and hotel accommodation being given at Edson during Sunday, and meals on the special train to the various destinations.
