speed and had not taken the proper precautions against accident on the narrow roadway which was also used for pedestrian traffic. This negligence, it was claimed, had been responsible for the boy being hit and injured. The lad has had to receive treatment ever since the accident and is at present a patient at the Vancouver General Hospital.

The defendants claimed the boy had been struck through no fault of their own. He had virtually stepped from behind a parked car right into the approaching motor driven by White. No manner of precautions could have prevented an accident under such circumstances. White denied having driven at an excessive rate of speed and declared that he had his car under control at all times.

In dismissing the action His Lordship declared that the plaintiff had failed to prove that there was negligence on the part of the defendants. It had failed to prove that defendant, White, was driving his car at an excessive rate of speed. White was unable to find anything supporting a conclusion that White had not exercised such care as necessitated under the circumstances.
