#### Pulp and Paper Timber Becoming Scarce.

Canada produces annually about \$100,000,000 worth of pulp and paper products. During the past ten years, especially, the industry has made rapid progress, until it is now one of the most important in the country. The three outstanding requisites for the maintenance of the industry are large accessible forest areas, particularly of spruce and balsam, adequate cheap power, preferably water-power, and a plentiful supply of labor. As to the two former, nature has been prodigal in her gifts to Canada. adm Water-power is not only abundant but is widely distributed. The virgin coniferous forests of Eastern Canada were of vast extent, and it is perhaps not entirely surprising that the early settlers and explorers considered them to be all but illimitable.
