Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.

Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres. before receiving Crown Grant. Where pre-emptor in occupation not

less than 1 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, be cause of ill-health, or other cause, b granted intermediate certificate of im

provement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent resi dence may be issued, provided appli cant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as for feiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence

of at least 2 years are required. Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.
