CAPITAL AND LABOR INDUSTRIAL COUNCIL

Lieut. Joseph Clearibue Lectures on Subject in Victoria Recently.

Scientific management and the establishment of a provincial industrial parliament offer the solution to the present industrial difficulties in the opinion of Lieut. Joseph B. Clearibue, in an address at Victoria on the subject of cooperation between capital and labor. He outlined his plan very concretely, giving the various matters which would be dealt with the organization which he thought it advisable to form.

In opening, the speaker said: No one can accumulate anything whatever without becoming a capitalist. I believe that there should be two returns, one for labor and one for accumulated capital. I do not advocate state ownership. You cannot abolish private ownership without abolishing all accumulations of wealth."

An open forum where capital and labor might discuss their problems, a place where workers would be given their fundamental right to have a voice in the conditions under which they labored, was necessary. An industrial parliament would supply this need, said the speaker.
