### LOCAL NEWS

Glasses fitted by registered optometrist at Heilbronner's store.

Mildred Guthrie, for keeping a disorderly house, was fined \$50, with option of thirty days' imprisonment, by Magistrate McClymont in city police court this morning.

Miss Jean Harrison, R.N., lady superintendent, reporting at last night's monthly meeting of the hospital board, stated that the house was fairly busy just now. Miss Harrison referred to the success of local students at the recent Registered Nurses' examinations.

The hospital board last night filed a letter from Miss Zora McNab making application for the position of laboratory technician here. No action is to be taken meantime by the board in connection with the establishment of a laboratory which has often been mooted in the past.

On recommendation of the grounds committee, of which G. V. Wilkinson, is chairman, the hospital board last night voted Miss Jean Harrison, R.N., lady superintendent, the sum of \$10 to cover expenses in connection with seeds and plants used in the grounds of the Nurses' Home.

Frank Dibb, chairman of the finance committee, reported at last night's meeting of the hospital board that William McNeish, auditor of the Workmen's Compensation Board, had recently visited the hospital and found everything concerning his department in order.

At the suggestion of Frank Dibb the hospital board decided last night, subject to arrangement with Miss Jean Harrison, R.N., lady superintendent, to allow tests to be made as to radio interference supposedly emanating from the hospital. The suggestion was voiced that the bell system in the hospital might be responsible for some interference.

The school board, at its meeting last night, decided to send a letter of thanks to Robert J. Crombie of Vancouver for his address to the students last week.

D. C. G. MacKay, who has been conducting crab research work here for the Biological Board of Canada, sailed this afternoon on the Prince Charles for Vancouver. He is about to make a trip to Montreal.

The secretary of the school board was last night instructed to write to the Mayor asking to have some work at the High School completed. This work has been carried out under direction of the city engineer.

J. L. Stancliff and G. E. Wedge of England, who have been visiting at Smithers with Mr. Wedge's brother, who is a farmer in that district, arrived in the city on this afternoon's train from the interior and sailed on the Prince Charles for Vancouver.

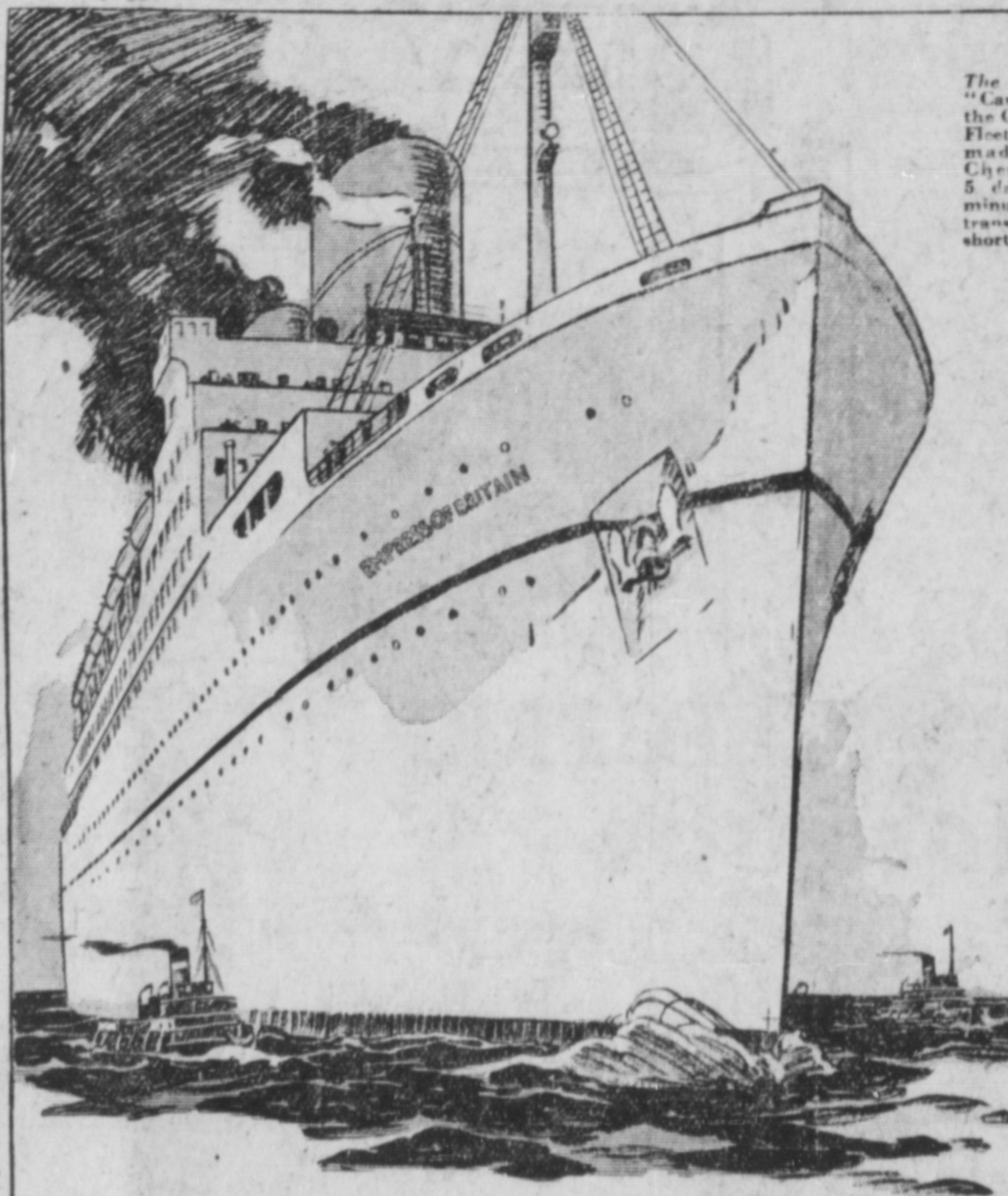
