Eliminated From Play-Off Position in National League Hockey—Maroons Beat Canadiens

NEW YORK, March 13—Detroit Falcons dropped out of the race for a berth in the National Hockey League American division play-offs last night when they were defeated by the lowly Philadelphia Quakers, the score being 7 to 5.

The Montreal Maroons, for the first time this season defeated the Canadiens 3 to nil by turning in one of their best efforts but the latter are still in first place in the Canadian section over the Toronto Maple Leafs who were idle last night. The Maroons and New York Americans are still battling for third place, the latter defeating Ottawa Senators 2 to nil last night and remaining half a point behind the Maroons.

Boston Bruins dropped a close 3 to 2 decision to the Chicago Black Hawks last night. The Bruins, Black Hawks and New York Rangers are assured of play-off berths in the American section.

ESKIMOS WIN GAME

Seattle Back on Top of Pacific Coast Loop by Beating Portland

PORTLAND, March 13—Seattle Eskimos went back into first place one point above Vancouver Lions in the Pacific Coast Hockey League last night by defeating Portland Buckaroos 3 to 1 in a hard fought speedy and clean game. The defeat meant Portland's definite elimination from the league play-off.

The Eskimos for a change played a wide-open game, a system which was conducive to fewer fouls than usual. There were about nine penalties in all. Good sportsmanship featured the match.

The first goal of the game came 14½ minutes after the start of play, Gordon Savage scoring for the Eskimos on a quick pass from Jack Walker, Aitkenhead having no chance to save. Just three minutes, forty-five seconds later, Dave Downie made Portland's first and only score on a pass from Armie Armstrong. It was only forty seconds after this that Ernie Anderson took a pass from Walker and scored Seattle's second. There were no penalties in the opening period.

About midway through the second period, Pete Belfoy netted it perfectly for the Eskimos' third and last goal on a pass from Red Stewart immediately after a face-off.

The Buckaroos abandoned all fence tactics in the final period in the vain effort to score. Reversely, the Eskimos bunched up in front of Dave Kemp who kept a wonderful goal throughout the game.

The final game of the season will be played next Thursday when the Buckaroos meet Vancouver Lions.
