So Far This Year Flames Have Done Little Damage in City of Prince Rupert

The fire department responded to eight alarms during the month of March. The only occasion when damage was done was at the home of C. G. Minns on Summit Avenue when a hole was burned through the roof. Damage here is roughly estimated at \$25.

So far this year the department has responded to 18 alarms with damage estimated at \$133 as against 21 calls in the first three months of 1930 with damage amounting to \$10,335.
