NEW PUBLICATION ISSUED AT OTTAWA

Committee on Conservation Issues
Most interesting Book.

A very interesting and instructive book, "Water Powers of British Columbia," has appeared from Ottawa. It is published by the Committee of Conservation and is a very authentic and comprehensive volume. Besides the invaluable information it is profusely illustrated with views of all parts of the province.

Many points in Northern B. C. are taken up, including Nechako River, Francois Lake, Hagwilget Canyon, Kitselas Canyon, Ecstall and Khatada Rivers. The work of exploration done by Ritchie & Agnew on the two latter streams is mentioned at some length.

At the City Council meeting last night it was decided to lay a sidewalk on Jeffrey St., between 6th and 8th Avenues, the city to pay half the cost. Of the remainder the owners on the north side pay one third and the south side two thirds.
