- 3 cups rolled oats
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 3 teaspoons Magic Baking Powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup lard
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup milk

Put rolled oats into a bowl. Sift flour, baking powder and salt and sugar together, add to oats. Melt butter and lard, add to dry mixture with milk. Mix all together, roll, cut with round cutter and bake in moderate oven.

Fill with following mixture: 1 pound chopped dates, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 cup hot water. Cook well and put between cookies.

Or finish cookies as illustrated. Have filling ready when you make cookie dough, when cookies are shaped with small cutter, cut centres from half the round, place a spoonful of the thick date filling on uncut rounds, put the open ones over the filling, pinch edges together well and bake at moderate heat.
