

Landings Light

Halibut landings at the port of Prince Rupert for the season to date, totalling 583,340 pounds, make a sorry comparison with 2,413,900 pounds which had been landed up l to a similar date last year. Canadian landings to date this year have I amounted to 400,800 pounds as compared with 755,100 pounds at the I same date last year. To date in 1931 there have been only 182,540 pounds of American fish landed as against 1,658,800 pounds. If marketing arrangements are to continue to keep American halibut out of Prince Rupert, the serious situation will no doubt continue.

During the week just past landngs totalled only 125,500 pounds as compared with 757,700 pounds in the corresponding week of 1930. The week's Canadian landings totalled 02,000 pounds and American, 23,-500 pounds or not as much as one fair-sized boat would bring.
