# BRONZE TABLET COMMEMORATES FALLEN HEROES

President S. D. Macdonald and Rev. H. R. Grant Preside at St. Andrew's Memorial Service.

The memorial tablet to the fallen members of the St. Andrew's Society was unveiled in their hall yesterday afternoon in the course of a very impressive service. There was a large attendance of members of the society and sympathizing friends.

Dr. Grant, the chaplain of the society, in the course of the service emphasized the ideals that prevailed in the hearts of these men who had laid down their lives on the battlefield. Their actions and sacrifices had been inspired not only by a deep love of country but they realized that justice and freedom were at stake. They had unselfishly laid down their lives that the people at home might enjoy those ideals and privileges. It was up to us if we would perpetuate and appreciate those privileges that they had won for us. Now is no time for personal prejudices but a time for the old British traditions of unselfish endeavor by the one for the many. If we live up to their ideals then their sacrifices will not have been in vain.

"Today," spoke Dr. Grant, "the world is in a melting pot and her governments and ancient customs are being re-shaped. I have no fear, for our nation is pointing forward and is not afraid of the issue. I am, however, afraid of what may come if affairs are to be settled by men who are actuated by personal prejudice instead of inspired ideals, men who may defer to their own interests when these men, whose names appear on this tablet died in unselfish sacrifice. We have been truly bought by their blood and we dare not lose sight of their ideals. Their memory must be indelibly traced on our hearts as well as on this tablet."

The tablet was formally unveiled by President S. D. Macdonald and the ceremony was of truly Scottish nature. As soon as the Union Jack had been pulled away, Piper James Sturgeon, himself a returned man, marched at a slow pace past the memorial, playing "Scots Wha Hae."

The memorial is a work of art in burnished bronze on a black field. The letters are in raised embossing and there are fourteen names inscribed. Under the crest of the Scottish Lion is the following text:

"In reverent and lasting memory of the following members of the St. Andrew's Society, Prince Rupert, B. C., who were killed in action in the Great European War, 1914-1918: A. Brighton, C. Dennis, W. Elliot, J. Florence, George Heggie, H. Hunter, N. Keith, N. Mackay, J. W. McKinnon, J. McVittie, James Russell, R. A. Stalker, James Stewart and J. S. Watt.

HAMILTON, Dec. 22.—The executors of the estate of John Lennox, wholesale shoe merchant, are suing the accident insurance companies for \$118,500.

Mystery surrounds the death of Lennox and although the common verdict is that he died from drowning, the accident insurance companies maintain that he died a natural death, which would relieve them of payment of the insurance. Straight life insurance policies totalling \$240, have been paid to the beneficiaries since the death last summer.
