TERRACE, Oct. 21.-Hon. R. W. Bruhn addressed a crowded gathering in the Legion Hall, Terrace, on Monday night and won the hearty cheers of his hearers.

J. K. Gordon, as chairman of the Board of Trade, presided and introduced Mr. Bruhn.

The dominating principle of the department of public works, said Mr. Bruhn, was the completion of the main skeleton-the most important links—of the central British Columbia highway system just as rapidly as the finances of the province would permit. Good roads were essential not only to the development and the progress of the province, but also to the happiness and prosperity of the people.

The science of highway construction and design during the last few years had received the intensest study of the best minds, and it was a matter of pride that his department was constantly being called on by other authorities for advice and help in meeting highway difficul-
