### Dowry on Bride In Greece to Be Banned by Gov't

ATHENS, Greece, March 20:-A profound change in the status of women of Greece is foreshadowed by the decision of the committee for revision of the civil code to abolish the legal obligation of a father to provide a dowry for his daughter

Heretofore in Greece, as in most Southern European countries, the dowry has played a large part in all marriages. An important faction. however, recently declared that girls should work for a living rather than sit at home and wait for husbands. Its view has prevailed.

Already Grecian women have emerged from the obscurity that was their lot for centuries. They have been granted municipal suffrage, entry into professions and enrollment at the Greek universities. One of the most noted editors in Athens as a woman.
