CONSCRIPTION

The latest information that comes from Australia is to the effect that the majority of the voters there are definitely against the introduction of conscription with regard to military service. The majority there still believe that the voluntary system can be made successful. And their belief is borne out by the Australian soldiers in the field. With the inclusion of the returns of the soldiers' vote, the majority against conscription has largely increased.

Now it cannot be said that the people of Australia wish in any way to drop out of the war. They have signified their intention of staying with it to the bitter end. The Australian people are at war. Like the people of Canada, they are a self-governing commonwealth. The will of the majority is law. The Australian government have adopted the course advocated by Sir Wilfrid Laurier in Canada. Likewise, also, they have had an election this year, notwithstanding war conditions.

Having done there what Sir Wilfrid Laurier proposed to do in Canada, the slanders and vilifications, and misrepresentations which were heaped upon Laurier here for his proposals will find a fitting resting place upon our brethren in Australia for what they have accomplished. That is, if the ultra-patriots who were so profuse with exaggerated expressions before the last election here are honest. But the same people who were so insistent that Canada would drop out of the war by taking a referendum on the question of conscription will hardly have the same to say regarding Australia. Yet conditions were largely the same there. The proportion of immigrants to native born Australians is also large, and the same reason for the taking of this second referendum upon the question is given, which is that recruiting under the voluntary system was falling off. Yet Laurier was "disloyal." Laurier was termed a "traitor." Laurier wanted Canada to "drop

out of the war," according to quite a large number of people who prefer to jump to conclusions, instead of arriving there logically. But is all Australia disloyal? Are all Australians who voted for no conscription "traitors?" Can it be said that Australia wants to drop out of the war? A thousand times no. Australia had a fleet which was able to protect its immense coast line from invasion and its shipping from destruction at the hands of enemy raiders. Remember the Emden. Canada might have had a navy too, instead of having had to depend on other countries. A statesman named Laurier once proposed such a thing, but he was removed from power because he was "too British." But that is by the way.

The Australian troops have covered themselves with glory imperishable, in Egypt, in Palestine, and at Gallipoli. Does anyone think for a minute that their boys who have done such great deeds are going to be "deserted" just because conscription has been turned down?

The prophets who knew so much about what would have happened to the Canadian soldiers had the measure not received popular approval will doubtless suffer vicarious anguish for the poor Australian soldiers.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

Germany will not bind herself regarding the "no annexation" clause in the peace terms with Russia, without guarantees from the Allies. Wants a guarantee of her colonies back, evidently. This is where Australia and South Africa will have something to say.

With thirty-eight thousand workmen paid off in the metal plants in Petrograd, which are closing down, the economic situation there will not be much improved. With recruiting stopped, and no other employment in sight, the Bolsheviks will have something on their hands when these thousands get hungry.
