BROWN IS CONFIDENT

Looks For Big Future For Placer
Country North of Canadian
National Railways

A potential second Klondike lies in the district between Ingenika River and the Atlin area of Northern British Columbia, according to M. J. Brown, prospector and representative of numerous associated interests in the placer mining field. The scene, discovered last autumn, lies 350 miles by trail north of Burns Lake and requires two months' travel on foot or three hours by air. "There has already been a lot of exaggeration about McConnell Creek," said Mr. Brown. "Stories that miners were making \$40 a day are wrong. My outfit is the only one operating at present. Some gold we took out some time ago was a cleanup from the shaft we sank to bedrock—a depth of 140 feet. But I haven't any doubt about the richness of the district. We are a closed corporation and have nothing to sell."

Mr. Brown, in reviewing the conditions, said: "The structure of the country is similar to that of the Klondike. In fact, there was a rush at McConnell Creek in 1898, but miners left them when they got news of Klondike and I believe they overlooked territory just as rich as the Klondike."

"There is virgin territory of about 900 square miles that I believe will eventually be explored properly, and I am convinced from what prospecting I have done in the north that a great placer field will be developed."

J. A. Frew was the speaker at the regular weekly luncheon of the Prince Rupert Rotary Club in the Commodore Cafe today, giving an interesting discourse on horticultural subjects. Among those present at the luncheon was W. Solway of Vancouver, executive commissioner of the Boy Scouts' Association for British Columbia and member of the Vancouver Rotary Club. G. H. Munro, president of the club, was in the chair.

PEACE HAS MUCH COAL

Investigation shows that coal of good quality to the extent of some six hundred million tons can be easily mined from the Peace River Block of Northern British Columbia. Moreover, eighteen thousand million board feet of timber is accessible, and there are some six hundred and twenty square miles of favorable structure areas for the production of petroleum and natural gas. Of the total area of nearly twenty million acres, of which only 893,000 have been alloted, 2,230,000 are suitable for cultivation, and 11,000,000 suitable for grazing lands.

With the laying of the railway another step towards the development of Canada's wealthy northern hinterland and another contribution to the Dominion's industrial prosperity will have been made.

Waterpower. — Over 150,000 h.p. in Peace River block and a minimum of 50,000 h.p. in the three southern blocks.

Geologists report 3,630 square miles with lode mineral possibilities and 9,400 square miles of favorable area for placer gold. Other non-metallic minerals are reported "potentially important."

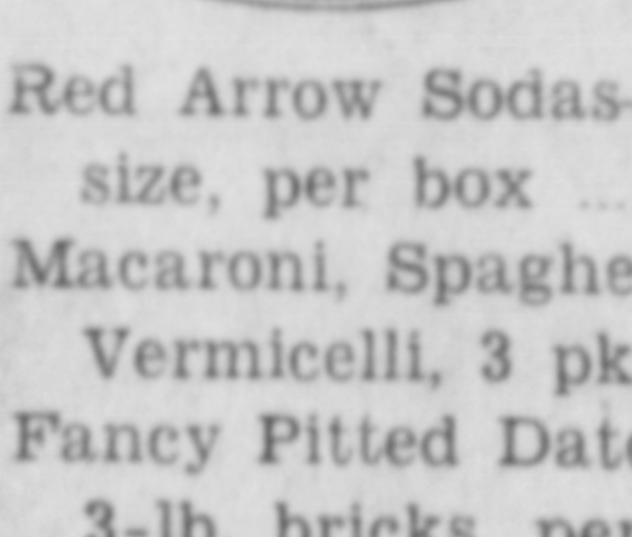

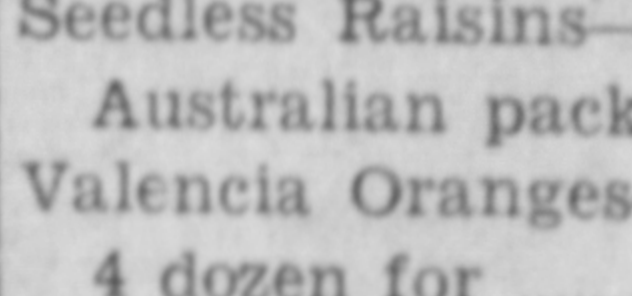
