In the case of single men the need for a cash benefit is not so great, but it is certainly desirable that, where the wage earner is ill, some cash should be coming in to care for the needs of the family. On the other hand the primary consideration is medical and hospital care. Strictly speaking, a cash benefit is not sickness insurance, but a form of unemployment insurance and in periods of unemployment the temptation to remain ill would be very great. In maternity cases, however, this objection does not apply as it would be difficult to imagine this being used to prolong cash benefits during periods of depression. During this trying time in a woman's life, it is particularly desirable that she have a little extra cash to better provide the comforts of life, so necessary at this time to preserve the health of both mother and
