CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Jan. 28:-The Harvard University graduate school of education has commenced an experiment in the use of talking pictures in education in junior high schools in Greater Boston. The tests to discover the value of films as a supplementary aid in teaching science will be made in the junior high schools of Lynn, Quincy and Revere and will continue for six weeks.

Three hundred students will be instructed with films and textbooks and a larger "control group" will be instructed with text books alone. At the end of the period both groups will be given tests. The films deal with physiology and biology, each unit consisting of a chapter of text together with a talking film presenting the fundamentals of the subject.
