Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$2.50 an acre. Pre-emption new confined to sur-

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land. Partnership pre-emptions abelished but parties of not more than four may with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where pre-empter in occupation not less than I years, and has made proportionate imprevements, he may, be cause of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent resi-

dence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 6 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required. Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he

requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, proand residence maintained on Crown Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20

acres, may be leased as homesites; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be factory or industrial sites on may be purchased; conditions include
