Northern Marine District Announced

Digby Island Marine Station at Last to be Center of Northern Waters; Appointments being made and Full Staff Here Soon.

(Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.) VICTORIA, Dec. 29.—It has been definitely announced here that the Prince Rupert marine district is to be separate from the Victoria district.

The new district will include all the waters north of Egg Island in Queen Charlotte Sound. It has not yet been decided which of the boats belonging to the department will come north to make their headquarters at Digby Island.

NO TITLES FOR CANADIANS IN HONORS LIST

Customary Honors for Canadian Subjects Omitted for First Time in History of Dominion.

KING REQUESTED TO REFRAIN AND DOES SO

FIXED WHEAT PRICE RAISED

Canadian Wheat Board Boosts Price of Grain in Storage; Will Permit Import of U. S. Product.

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.) WINNIPEG, Dec. 29.—The Canadian Wheat Board has made the following important announcement: "The price of Manitoba No. 1 Northern wheat to mills in Canada is raised from \$2.30 per bushel to \$2.80.

In order that the consuming public may have the advantage of a supply of the cheaper flour in the United States, permits will be issued for the import of American products."

Bread to Increase. OTTAWA, Dec. 29.—Reports received here from all over the country indicate that the price of bread will increase from two to three cents a loaf owing to the advance in the wheat and flour prices authorized by the Canadian Wheat Board.

FIGHTING IN SYRIA

PARIS, Dec. 29.—Arabian volunteers and French troops have clashed at Baalbec in Syria. The losses on both sides were severe.

Admiral Jellicoe's Report to be Made Before End of Year to Government.

FAVORS IDEA OF NAVY UNDER DOMINION CONTROL

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.) OTTAWA, Dec. 29.—The recommendation of Admiral Jellicoe as to the naval policy best suited to the new world conditions as they affect Canada, is expected to be in the hands of the Government between now and the end of the year.

Sir Robert Borden was at the 1918 conference, when he cited Australia as an example of the successful working of such a navy in conjunction with the Imperial Navy.

FLATLY DENIES ANY DOLLY VARDEN DEAL

Head of Taylor Mining Co. Makes Plain That no Thought of Sale is Entertained.

A. J. T. Taylor, the president of the Taylor Mining Co., which owns the Dolly Varden Mine at Alice Arm, flatly denied the report that the Dolly Varden sold or that any deal was even pending, in Vancouver Friday last.

Since the completion of the railway this summer the mine has been shipping steadily and though the most of the ore has gone to the Anyox smelter, some quantities of extra high-grade rock have gone to Tacoma.

SEVERE CONGESTION OF TRAFFIC AT DOCKS IN GREAT BRITAIN

Cash Register, Three Plate Glass Windows, Door, Mirrors and Kitchen Windows Smashed in Allies Cafe.

The newly opened Allies Cafe, Sixth Street, in the Westenhaver Building, was badly wrecked about 8 o'clock Sunday night at the hands of Fred. Gullett, who seemingly ran amuck on entering a cafe operated by Chinese.

He entered the Chinese Cafe last evening and, evidently, soon got in some altercation with the attendants. The result was that soon he was throwing bottles and every other article that came into his hands at random at the plate glass windows, mirrors and crockery.

Many Deaths From Methylated Mixture

Police Arrest Five Men of Organization Peddling Poisonous Liquor. Over a Hundred dead and many Blinded.

ALLIES TAKING FULL INVENTORY OF GERMAN MARINE EQUIPMENT

PARIS, Dec. 29.—The Supreme Council has decided to send a commission to Germany to take an inventory of the docks at Hamburg and Dantzie. This action has followed the charges that Germany is withholding part of her assets in marine materials which were demanded by the allies as reparation for the sinking of the warships at Scapa Flow.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—Viscount Grey, British ambassador to the United States, will leave Washington on Tuesday for New York whence he will sail for home on the following Saturday.
