The Development of The Great Northland.

During this month of December the Government proposed to summon to a conference at Ottawa from all quarters men who have an intimate knowledge of the far North. This conference is for the dual purpose of discussing the possibility of increasing the country's meat supply and also the transportation problem in these difficult latitudes.
