In Prince Rupert

April 19, 1912

David H. Hays left this morning on the steamer Prince George for Vancouver whence he will proceed to Montreal where he has been called on account of the drowning of his brother, Sir Chas. M. Hays, president of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, in the wreck of the steamer Titanic. A total of 2348 persons were lost with the Titanic. A memorial service for the victims of the wreck will be held in the Westholme Theatre here.

Patrick Fred Carroll, aged 6 years and one month, and Frederick Henry Carroll, 4 years and two months, have arrived from England to join their parents at Calgary. They travelled unaccompanied across the Atlantic Ocean on the steamer Lake Manitoba.

Carpenter of the Department of Agriculture, and William Manson, M.P.P., sailed last night on the Prince John for an inspection trip to the Queen Charlotte Islands. They were accompanied by E. M.
