2 eggs 1 cup sugar 2 cups pastry flour (or 134 cups bread flour) 3/4 cup milk 2 teaspoons Magic Baking Powder

Walter Damrosch heard her sing in the Royal Opera House, Berlin, in 1894 and induced her to come to the United States. She made her American debut at the Metropolitan the next year as Elsa in "Lohengrin" and eventually became a popular prima donna of Wagnerian operas, most of which she learned after coming to Am-

She was married to Captain Tauscher in 1893. They had one daughter; Lotte, who was her mother's constant companion.


