After the Klondike rush died down and the Grand Trunk Railway was put through the Hudson's Bay Company found no further use for the property and sold it in 1912 to R. J. McDonnell.

Pedigree Stock.

The ranch comprises 640 acres of which 400 are under cultivation now. With the land equipment, the purchasers have taken over 120 head of gange cattle, the stock of a Government pedigree short horn five-year-old bull, twenty horses bred by a Milwaukee pedigree Percheron stallion, and sixty pigs raised from Pole Angus pedigree boar.

To Harness Water-Power.

They will also supply power to neighboring ranchers.

Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land. Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may with joint residence, but each making

necessary improvements on respective Pre-emptore must occupy claims for five years and make imprevements to value of \$10 per sere, including clearing and cultivation of at least & acres, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where pre-empter in occupation not less than I years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence may be issued, provided appli cant makes imprevements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Fallure to make imprevements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including & acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years are required.

Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites;

title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.

Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased; conditions include
