HERRING PLENTIFUL IS GENERAL REPORT

Run Has Commenced Much Ahead of Usual Time—Quality of Fish Reported Excellent.

VICTORIA, Dec. 29.—Fisheries Inspector E. G. Taylor, in charge of District No. 3, reports that the herring season is this year considerably earlier than usual, with an excellent run of fish.

Reports from Nanaimo are to the effect that the prospects are better than ever known, and similar information also comes from the operators on Barclay Sound, who state that they are already running to capacity.

PRICE OF CANNED GOODS IS SHADED

TORONTO, Dec. 29.—Lower prices for canned goods are looming up on the horizon as a result of a statement made by Chairman W. A. O'Connor at a sitting of the Board of Commerce. He stated that he would make a declaration from Ottawa that the rebate of two and a half cents a dozen on canned goods now allowed by the Dominion Canners, Limited, would be illegal. In consequence, wholesalers may be advised to sell canned goods at somewhat lower prices.

Representatives of the Canadian Wholesalers Grocers Association intimated that there would not be any rebate paid to the wholesalers, but that the public would ultimately benefit from it.

ARMY OF FOUR MILLION WOMEN TO FIGHT H. C. I.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—An army of 4,000,000 women representing ten national organizations has been organized by the savings division of the treasury department, to enter the fight against the high cost of living.

Beginning January 1 and extending to April, a great thrift campaign will be conducted in an effort to induce women to keep strict accounts of their daily expenditures in order by study of them to eliminate unnecessary items. According to the plan, amounts saved by this means would be invested in government securities.
