In addition, the vessels carrying this Canadian trade are, if necessary, repaired in United States dry docks and the supplies come from United States factories. Further, they are provisioned from United States farms. And, then do not let us forget that millions of bushels of the wheat which went through Buffalo this year for export was bonused by the Canadian people at the rate of five cents a bushel.
