done for the relief of the people. Dr. Mandy Heard

Dr. Mandy explained that large portion of the mineral wealth of Prince Rupert district was tied up in silver. Since 1930 the industry had become dormant, mines were closed, men thrown out of employment and the depression car. Just call Nelson's Taxi 849. accentuated. At Prince Rupert's very door there were numerous mining properties which would be men if the price of silver could be restored.

The trouble, Dr. Mandy continued, was not overproduction of silver but rather a maldistribution. India and China, for example, were overstocked with silver, and, owing to many nations going on the gold standard following the war. the price had become debased and the purchasing powers of such countries seriously restricted.

It was vital to Prince Rupert district that the value of silver should be restored, Dr. Mandy contended, and it was very timely that this city should advocate a case like this.

Rudderham Not Satisfied

In spite of the explanations of Ald. Casey and Dr. Mandy, Ald. Rudderham was not satisfied that standardization of silver would bring about any such improvement as was predicted. He thought there was something even more deeprooted than this wrong with a system such as the present which allowed people to virtually starvo while warehouses were loaded to their roofs with food. The sooner such a system collapsed, the better it would be.


