Head of Victoria Department Gives Interesting Talk on His Work

Fire prevention and fire fighting was the subject of an interesting address yesterday afternoon at the weekly luncheon of the Prince Rupert Rotary Club by V. W. Stewart, chief of the Victoria fire department and provincial grand prior of the Knights Templars.

Mr. Stewart, who has been fire fighting for many years and who knew the Prince Rupert fire chief before Prince Rupert was founded, laid stress on the fact that fire fighting was now a profession and a good deal of study was required to keep a member of the staff up to date. He found that his men at Victoria read technical books and fully qualified themselves for the work. The great thing was to get into the fire and at the same time keep down the amount of damage done by fire and water. In this work chemicals were used very largely.

The chief suggested that people travelling should always investigate the egress so that in case there should be a fire they would be able to escape. Many lives had been lost because of failure to do this.
