**Hays Cove School Will Necessitate
Changes and Improvements**

The School Board decided at its meeting last night to make two applications to the City Council for changes in connection with public utilities and the new Hays Cove School.

The board will ask the council to formulate some local improvement sewer scheme to provide for connection to the Hays Cove school and also the houses in the district adjacent which have not yet been connected up with the main sewerage system.

The board will also ask the City Council to remove the water main which now crosses through the centre of the site in line with Sixth Avenue.
