German Champion Prepared to Meet Jack Sharkey in 15 Rounds in June

NEW YORK, Jan. 19:-Joe Jacobs, manager of Max Schmeling, world heavyweight boxing champion, announced last night that Schmeling was prepared to meet Jack Sharkey in a 15-round bout for the title in June.

Jacobs expiained that Schmeling was tired of being accused of dodging Sharkey and was prepared to meet the Boston gob any time and any where. The champion's only stipulation was that the bout should be of at least 15 rounds duration.

Schmeling is not recognized as the champion by the New York Boxing Commission on the grounds that he avoided a meeting with Sharkey, who is rated by the Commission as the outstanding heavyweight.
