STATES ARE RESUMING TRADE WITH GERMANS

Volume of Business is Beginning to Assume Important Proportions.

The United States has resumed trading with Germany on a large scale, says the Financial Post. Exports to Germany for the first ten months of the year totalled \$52,420,095, of which \$20,663,521 was exported during October. To the end of September imports valued at \$2,757,179 had been received in the United States from Germany.

Trade relations between the United States and Germany were resumed in July of this year, but it has only been within the last two or three months that the trade has shown signs of attaining any volume.

CANADA'S WAR BALANCE

Great Britain is Now in Our Debt For \$200,000,000.

An adjustment of accounts between the Canadian and the British Government resulting from the war is now in progress, says the Financial Post.

The British Government has financed Canadian operations on the other side, while the Canadian Government has established imperial credits here. The only credit now operating is for the purchase of timber, though arrangements regarding the wheat crop are to be made. As the balance now stands, Great Britain owes Canada \$200,000,000, interest on which is being paid at 5 1/2 per cent.
