OTTAWA, May 12:- The House of Commons took the first step toward nationalization of radio broadcasting vesterday when it adopted, without a dissenting voice, the report of the committee of the house recommending a government-owned system. Premier R. B. Bennett then gave notice of his intention to introduce a bill today establishing a commission to operate the system which was also recommended in the committee's report.
