### 'FRISCO MAYOR SCHMITZ, BROKE

Once Famous Character Down on His Uppers

Former Mayor Schmitz, who escaped going to San Quentin prison with former Boss Abe Ruef by the slenderest legal technicality, and who is now at liberty on heavy bonds, has lost all his fortune. Schmitz is said to be dead broke, all his business ventures having gone wrong. He was poor when elected mayor, but is said to have quit very wealthy.

When Schmitz was trying to get out of jail on bail he obtained the assistance of William J. Dingee, an Oakland capitalist. In turn Dingee induced Schmitz to invest money in a large cement factory near Santa Cruz. This company was dragged down into ruin when Dingee failed last year, and Schmitz lost every cent he had invested in it. Then the mine which Schmitz put considerable money into at Oroville, in Butte county, pinched out after showing some very rich ore.

In despair, Schmitz then started for Sinaloa, Mexico, where his brother is interested in some mines, but a letter was received by one of his old friends saying the mine is worthless and Schmitz is stranded and needs money to get out of the country and reach home. It is estimated that Schmitz made half a million dollars, but the only thing that remains is a home which is in his wife's name. All the other property has taken wings.

### ABOUT OTHER FAMOUS CANALS

Facts about the World's Leading Waterways—Giant Enterprises which Cost Fabulous Sums.

The interest in the Panama Canal aroused by Mr. Magee's lecture last night, makes comparisons interesting. The Panama Canal with its length of fifty miles, width of three hundred feet and depth of forty-one feet had cost up to the end of last year a sum of \$312,000,000.

The famous Erie canal was opened in 1825, has a length of 363 miles, a width of seventy feet and a depth of seven feet, and cost about \$50,000,000. The Illinois and Michigan canal was opened in 1848; it is ninety-six miles long and cost about \$6,000,000. The Chesapeake and Ohio canal is 185 miles in length and cost about \$12,000,000. The Wash and Erie is 274 miles in length.

The Suez canal was opened in 1869, and is ninety-nine miles long, 420 feet wide at its surface, and thirty-one feet deep. Its cost was about \$100,000,000. The Manchester canal, 1894, is about thirty-six miles in length, 300 feet wide and twenty-six feet deep. Its cost was about \$75,000,000. The North Sea and Baltic is sixty-one miles long and 220 feet wide and cost \$30,000,000.

### PLACER CHANCES ON THE NAAS

Valuable Hint to Would-be Prospectors from Prince Rupert

The placer ground on the Naas where the April strike was made, according to Mr. F. W. Wright, one of the pioneer prospectors of the Naas river valley, shows colors all the way down, but nowhere on the forty claims staked has bedrock been reached. The prospect is so good that men have returned, packing in supplies, which include pumping gear. In addition to the snow difficulty, surface water interferes with the mining operations beyond a certain depth, and to obviate this, pumping gear has been packed in over the glacier.

Miss Spencer was visiting the island with her uncle and aunt, Major and Mrs. McGillicuddy of Kerry, while Mr. Greenwood was visiting Jamaica as the guest of the late Sir Alfred Jones. Major McGillicuddy met him in Kingston and asked him to lunch, and it was then that the engaged couple first met. It was a momentous occasion in a double sense, for at the conclusion of the lunch the first shock of an earthquake was felt.
